200 years ago on May 7, 1824, perhaps Ludwig von Beethoven's masterpiece Ninth Symphony was first performed in Vienna. How remarkable the symphony sounds, especially when one considers the composer was completely deaf at this time. Although people may not realize it, one of the greatest chorales in classical music and best-known hymns tunes is perhaps the climax of this symphony. Beethoven was unaware of the thunderous applause until one of the musicians turned him around to face the audience. Haruki Murakami wrote, "A deaf composer is like a cook who's lost his sense of taste. A frog that's lost its webbed feet. A truck driver with his license revoked. That would throw anybody for a loop, don't you think? But Beethoven didn't let it get to him. Sure, he must have been a little depressed at first, but he didn't let misfortune get him down. It was like, Problem? What problem? He composed more than ever and came up with better music than anything he'd ever written."

In honor of this occasion, I have selected some wonderful words of wisdom.

- I wish you music to help with the burdens of life, and to help you release your happiness to others.
- What I have in my heart and soul must find a way out. That's the reason for music.
- I have never thought of writing for reputation and honor. What I have in my heart must come out; that is the reason why I compose.
- Then let us all do what is right, strive with all our might toward the unattainable, develop as fully as we can the gifts God has given us, and never stop learning.
- The vibrations on the air are the breath of God speaking to man's soul. Music is the language of God. We musicians are as close to God as man can be. We hear his voice, we read his lips, we give birth to the children of God, who sing his praise. That's what musicians are.
- In the country It seems as if every tree Said to me 'Holy! Holy!' Who can ever express the ecstasy of the woods! Almighty One, In the woods I am blessed. Happy every one in the woods. Every tree speaks through Thee. O God! What glory in the woodland.
- To play a wrong note is insignificant. To play without passion is inexcusable!
