April 1, 2023

The holiest week of the Church's Liturgical Year begins with Palm or Passion Sunday. Whenever Passover is devoutly celebrated, one of the youngest children present will ask, "Why is this night different from other nights?" The differences are explained and celebrated. I want to take this opportunity to explore what we do differently this week. Palm Sunday has two gospels, a blessing of and procession with palms, and the reading of the Passion according to Matthew with different parts and speakers, including the congregation. Mass this weekend begins in the Parish Hall.

Holy Thursday commemorates the Lord's Supper in which Jesus humbled himself to wash the feet of his disciples and give himself to us in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. The Holy Oils to be used in sacramental celebrations are presented. Fr. John will wash the feet of twelve parishioners of all ages and sexes. After we receive holy communion, the priest and ministers process with the Eucharist to the Chapel of Reservation. Please sign up for a time to spend with Jesus present in this Blessed Sacrament. We begin at 6pm.

On Good Friday at noon we have Stations of the Cross in the Church. The Good Friday Liturgy features Passion according to John with different parts and speakers, including the congregation. There are the Solemn Intercessions, Veneration of the Cross, and a Holy Communion Service with hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday.

My letter next weekend will focus on the beauty and solemnity of Easter Vigil and why everyone of us who was fully initiated into the Catholic Church during a previous Easter Vigil ought to make every effort to be here on April 8 at 8:30 pm.
