There are times when we really want to remember something early on in a sermon, only to forget it by the end.

Perhaps this is why I consider President Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address the best speech in the history of the USA. However, I think the *most important* speech to Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s I Have a Dream delivered from the steps of the Lincoln Memorial on August 28, 1963. It is almost certainly the defining moment of the Civil Rights movement.

In honor of his birthday, I encourage you to listen to this stirring speech and experience its inspiring vision of a country worth becoming and being. Watch with others and talk about.
