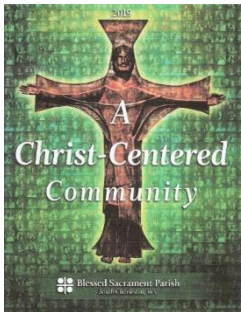
Heart and Hand - Bedding Program

Upcoming Flooring Project Late July through the first week of September

We are planning to have the asbestos floor tiles in the first and second floors removed and replaced with new flooring, which will be a combination of vinyl and carpet. This decision was made due to the health hazard posed by asbestos. The initial plan to replace the carpet in the first-floor hallway led to the discovery of asbestos-containing tiles throughout the building.

After consulting with John Reardon, Director of Buildings and Property for our Diocese, the Finance Council recommended addressing the asbestos issue now to prevent any future regrets. The total cost of the project is estimated to be around \$80,000, and we have applied for a 50% matching grant from the Diocese, along with funds set aside from previous years for capital projects.

The decision-making process involved various parties, including Parish Staff, Finance Council, Pastoral Council, and knowledgeable parishioners. The project will cause significant inconveniences, such as the closure of certain areas, limited parking access, and the temporary relocation of office spaces.

During this period, we ask for patience, kindness, and prayers for the workers' safety and our staff's well-being. Additionally, oatmeal raisin cookies are always welcome to lift spirits during this time.

SAINT OF THE WEEK:

Saint Mother Maria Guadalupe
Garcia Zavala ~ Mother Lupita. June 24

St. Maria Guadalupe Garcia Zavala, known as Mother Lupita, embraced a life of poverty while serving the poor and sick during a dangerous time in Mexico's history. Born in Mexico in 1878 into a family that ran a religious goods shop, Maria frequently visited the basilica next door to the shop, even at a young age. At 23, Maria told her spiritual director, Father Cipriano Iniguez, that she was no longer going to get married; instead she felt a strong calling to serve Jesus with an undivided heart by serving the poor and sick. Father Cipriano told Maria, in turn, of his desire to form a congregation that would care for the hospitalized. Maria broke off her engagement, and the two joined together to found an order of caregivers, The Handmaids of Saint Margaret Mary and the Poor.

Serving as a nurse when the congregation began in 1901, Maria cared for patients regardless of their wealth or status. As the superior general of her order, she provided an example of genuine joy in embracing poverty, often begging in the streets for funds for the hospital when needed. She sincerely believed that one can only truly be "poor with the poor" by loving and living in poverty. When the Catholic Church in Mexico underwent persecution beginning in 1911, Maria often put her own life at risk by hiding priests, including the Archbishop of Guadalajara, in her hospital. Maria served as the superior general of her order until her death in 1963. Canonized by Pope Francis on May 12, 2013, Maria became Mexico's second female saint. At her canonization Mass, the Holy Father said, "This new Mexican saint invites us to love as Jesus loved us ... to come out of ourselves and care for those who are in need of attention, understanding, and help, to bring them the warm closeness of God's love through tangible actions of sensitivity, of sincere affection and of love."

Virtus - Safe Environment Program and You!

Each employee and volunteer in a Catholic Church in the United States is required by their dioceses to meet certain certification requirements for their safe environment programs.

Last year, a whole big bunch of us pulled together to become certified through our diocesan Safe Environment Program.

As a result, the children and vulnerable adults in our community are surrounded by people who have a better awareness of how predators groom potential victims, how responsible adults conduct themselves around children and vulnerable adults, and how to report suspicious activity.

Our diocese just shared with us that its current program can be better. When you hear the new requirements, I hope we can agree these changes are good ones.

There are three changes:

1) Every employee and volunteer will have the most up-to-date training. If you trained last year – you're in! If not, we will have a few in-person sessions this fall to catch you up. (There will be food and fellowship, of course.) You can also do this through your online Virtus account.

2) Beginning in July, a variety of articles will be published in our bulletin once each month. They will each take about 3-minutes to read. These articles will also be available through your online Virtus account. The idea is to keep the need for a safe environment in the forefront of our minds.

3) Starting in 2025, there will be new training modules introduced each year. We'll do our best to make these times for fellowship; food, of course; and learning something new.

We hope most, if not all, of us will see these activities as ways we can show love for everyone in our community. These are small sacrifices of our time that could have huge impacts on the life of a child or vulnerable adult.
