## **Lent Fasting Rules: Frequently Asked Questions**

**What Is Fasting?** In the Catholic Church, fasting is a practice in self-discipline with a penitential focus. In the context of Lent, it refers to reducing food intake and limiting how many meals we have.

**What are the Lent fasting rules?** On Ash Wednesday & Good Friday, fasting rules allow Catholics to eat only one full meal and two smaller meals which, combined, would not equal a single normal meal. Additionally, Catholics may not eat meat on these two days—or on any Friday during Lent.

**What are the Lent rules on abstinence?** In this context, abstinence refers to “abstaining” from meat on Fridays during Lent. Whereas Catholics fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday with just one large meal, Catholics must refrain from eating meat on other Fridays, though they can have three full meals.

**At what age do you start fasting for Lent?** Those ages 18-59, in reasonable health, are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those 14 and older must abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent. Canon Law does mention that for children not fasting, parents should still communicate the meaning and penance.

**Who is exempt from fasting during Lent?** Children, adults with physical and mental illness, pregnant women, and those nursing are all exempt. The USCCB says “common sense should prevail” and that no one should jeopardize their health to fast.

**SAINT OF THE WEEK :**

Saint Aurea

March 11

On March 11, we celebrate the feast day of Saint Aurea (Santa Oria, 1042-1069) of San Millán de la Cogolla in Rioja, Spain. Saint Aurea, a virgin of the Church, demonstrated great love for the Lord, enclosing herself as an anchoress, working miracles, and receiving holy visions. Much of what we know about her life was recorded by Gonzalo de Berceo in his epic poem, *Vida de Santa Oria*.

Aurea was born of “good and religious parents,” García and Amunna, in the village of Villeveyayo, Spain. The region of Aurea’s birth had earlier been invaded by the Moors, and she was raised under Moorish control. Despite this, she felt drawn to the Scriptures, meditating on and studying them from an early age. Aurea also had an unquenchable love for the saints, reading and studying the lives of the early martyrs of the Church. She was particularly fond of Saints Agatha, Eulalia of Merida, and Cecilia, whose lives she attempted to emulate with her own.

Aurea felt drawn to the religious life and chose to become an anchoress attached to the cathedral at San Millan de la Cogolla. There she is said to have lived an austere monastic life and was graced by three visions of her favorite saints, encouraging her to live her faith more devoutly. Despite her humility, word of her visions spread, and she became sought out for advice and prayer. Through her intercession, many miracles were claimed. Aurea died at the young age of 27.

At a young age, Saint Aurea devoted herself to the Lord, sealing herself into a tiny barren cell, and giving up all worldly pleasures. She prayed tirelessly and demonstrated great devotion to God, the communion of Saints, and the Blessed Mother. Through her intercession, many were healed, and miracles were wrought. In our daily lives, we don’t generally receive visions like Saint Aurea did. But we are certainly graced by glimpses of heaven, and experiences of God in those we encounter. We only need look for them.

Dear Parishioners,

When I became your Pastor in June 2022, a remarkable project was nearing completion and soon to go online: the Solar Panels on the school roof. It has made a huge difference in our electric bill as evidenced when no solar power was harvested for more than a few weeks due to ice and snow. We owed \$6,245 to Appalachian Electric Power. Fr. John Finnell and the Finance Council were understandably proud of the fact that it was paid up front by parishioners.

The Energy Efficiency Committee recommended and the Finance Council agreed our Capital Improvement Project for this year will be to replace the church roof (worship area) and install solar panels. The panels atop the school produce 64% of our energy usage. New panels on the church roof will bring this up to 85%.

We are still eligible for government and N.G.O. grants if things work begins in 2025. These grants may not be available in 2026. We have a strong possibility of a \$50,000 grant from the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston to help with the project.

New Roof - \$98,128.                  New Solar Array - \$97,451. Project Total - \$195,579.

Here is how we hope to finance this improvement.

Now for some **GREAT** news. Several weeks ago, I explained the project to some of our most generous donors. We have already received \$57,000 with another \$31,000 pledged. This means we are already 73% of the way towards our goal!

Your donation can help us reach our goal. I ask that whatever you donate be both an expression of your heart felt appreciation for Blessed Sacrament Parish and be in addition to, and not a replacement of, whatever you regularly give. Please place your offering in the collection basket and write Building Project in the memo. Any grants or rebates we receive from the government will be set aside for future capital projects.

The parishioners of Blessed Sacrament are well-known for acts of generosity. Our first solar panel project was an excellent example of our ability to come together, and I am confident that this second phase will be equally successful. Thank you in advance for your generous gifts and commitment to care for our common home.

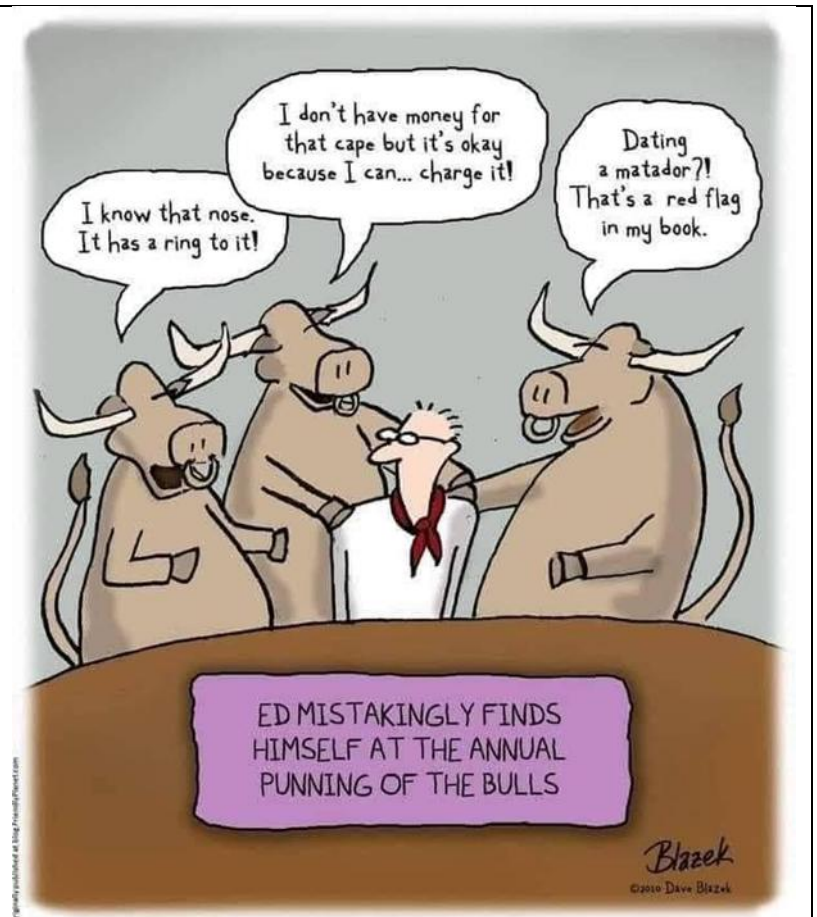
## WHERE'S WALTER?

## Parish Pastoral Council

### **Help is Needed**

Our parish is looking for a few parishioners to prayerfully consider serving the Lord and our parish as new members of our Pastoral Council for three-year terms.

**What is our Pastoral Council?** Our Pastoral Council is the body of parishioners who are responsible to keep the whole parish community focused on the Mission, the Goals, and the Objectives that we have discerned to be God's will for us. They are the primary body that advises and works with the pastor and staff about the well-being of the parish community as it strives to carry out its Mission. All parishioners aged 18 and above who are a baptized and confirmed Catholic and an active practicing member of the parish are eligible to serve, and new members will begin to serve in May 2024.

**How is the Council structured?** The Council consists of the Pastor, an occasional Staff member, and nine or more parishioners serving three-year staggered terms. It meets on the second Tuesdays of the month at 6pm in the Parish Hall. The Council strives for consensus on questions that are posed rather than majority vote. Consensus means a result that all members can live with, even if it is not our strongest preference.

**How does one recommend new members for the Pastoral Council?** Pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit for yourself and everyone. You may recommend it to as many people as you like. You may also recommend yourself. There will be nomination forms in the gathering space after each Mass for the three weeks.

### **What happens next?**

Please nominate one or more parishioners, perhaps yourself. The Pastoral Council nominating committee will review the nominations and contact those who are nominated to see if they are willing to prayerfully consider possible membership. Those who are recommended will be invited to attend an orientation and discernment process. The purpose is to better understand the commitment one is making. It will also include prayerful discernment seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit in choosing new members.
