Perhaps it comes from growing up with the NASA and the USA space program in the 1960's, listening to the countdown to launch: "T minus 10, 9, 8 etc." But I have always been fascinated by Top 10 Lists having to do with books, music, movies, TV shows, and more. My biggest complaint with such lists is when its creators do not include many (if any) selections from the Twentieth Century or earlier.

There seems to me to be a common misconception that anything old has nothing to offer in the sophisticated, modern times we live in. Here's an example of how untrue this is. Father Michael Müeller in an 1868 book on prayer discusses eight ways we can make our prayers pleasing to God.

- 1. We must pray for something good.
- 2. Our prayer must be humble.
- 3. Our prayer must be fervent.
- 4. We must change our life for the better.
- 5. We must forgive those who may have injured us.
- 6. We must do good works in our day-to-day life.
- 7. Our prayer must be confident.
- 8. Our prayer must be persevering.

As Jesus says to someone who questioned him, "Do this and you will live." (Luke 10:28) If we learn from Fr. Michael Müeller, we will pray better, too. BTW, please join other parishioners in praying a Novena to the Holy Spirit beginning this Friday.
